



Welcome Break

This project will bring wider benefits, including:

- 300 new, permanent jobs, along with local supply chain opportunities during the construction period
- 24% of the site dedicated to biodiversity net gain and creating habitats for wildlife
- Represents a capital investment of £155 million into the local area
- Major investment in Electric Vehicle Charging to reduce our carbon footprint
- Enhancement and improvement of local biodiversity habitats and extensive tree planting
- A safe place for motorists to stop and take a break whilst driving through Essex

An overview of our proposals

A new Motorway Service Area on the M25, located in the Roding Valley, between junctions 27 and 28

October 2024

Welcome Break is proposing to develop a new Motorway Service Area (MSA) to serve the busy M25 between junctions 27 (M11) and 28 (A12).

A new facility is needed on the M25 in this area to reduce the current 33-mile gap between South Mimms and Thurrock as well as the forthcoming 62-mile gap between South Mimms and Maidstone that will occur once the new Lower Thames Crossing has been developed. These gaps exceed the maximum spacing requirements of 28 miles (or a 30-minute drive time) between MSAs set by National Highways to meet the safety and welfare requirements of motorway users.

As a close neighbour, we want to bring the project to your attention and invite your views on the proposals before we submit a planning application to Brentwood Borough Council.

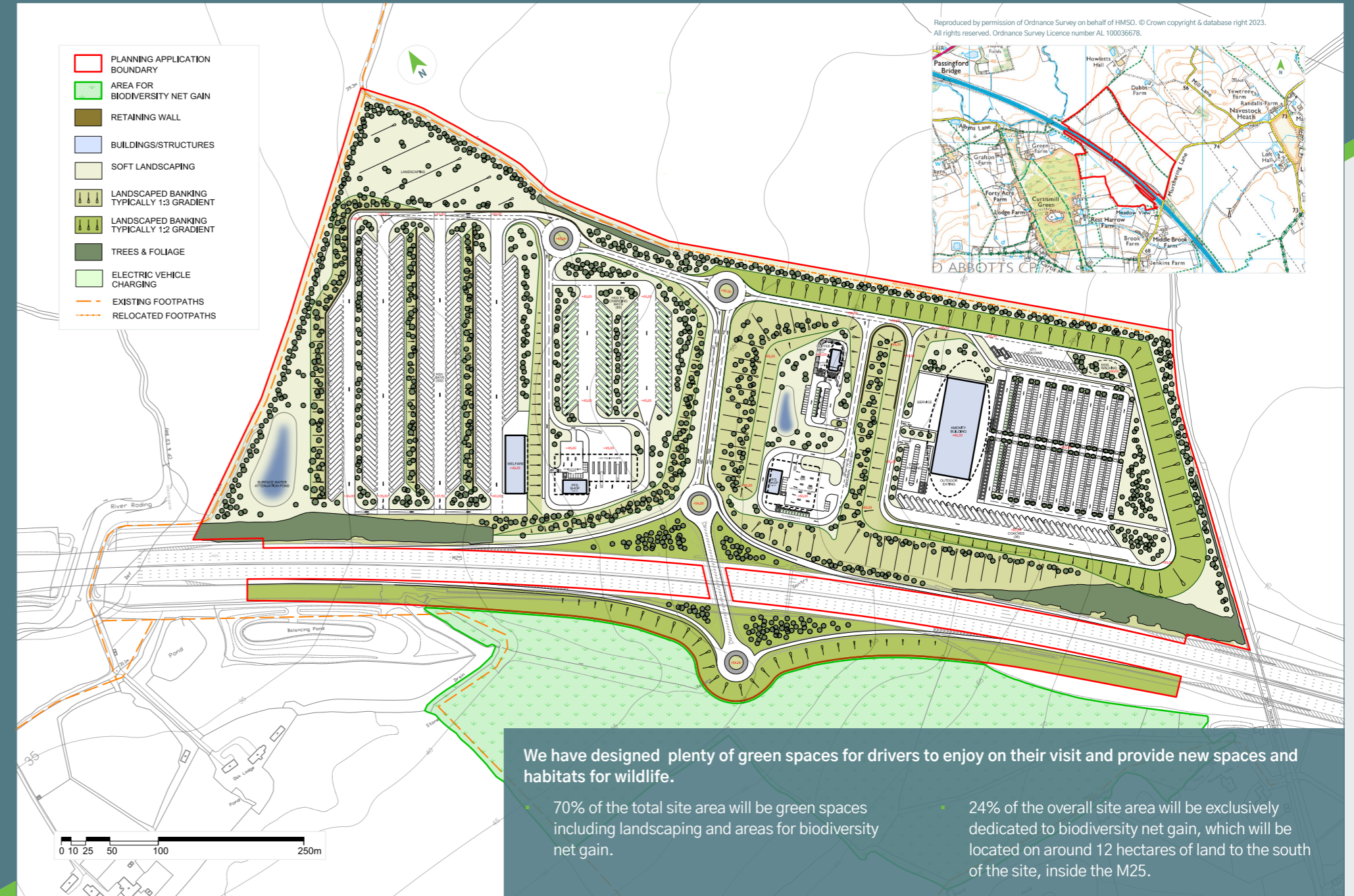

Welcome Break is committed to minimising the impact on close neighbours and our design team has developed a facility that we believe sets new standards in terms of its low impact on communities and the environment, whilst delivering a safe place for motorists to stop and take a break, on their journey through your county on the M25.

We appreciate that you may have concerns, and we wish to engage with you to hear your views.

Key design features include:

- The facility is **only** for the use of motorway traffic, with no vehicular access to local roads, including for staff and deliveries.
- The site will have 24/7 security management with complete CCTV coverage and perimeter fencing.
- The design makes good use of extensive tree planting around the perimeter and soft landscaping along the embankments will increase the screening for nearby communities.
- We will improve adjacent footpaths and bridleways and put in place new planting and fences.
- Our project sits on one side of the M25, allowing us space (24% of the total site area) to dedicate to create new open spaces and biodiverse wildlife habitats on the south side.
- Dedicated HGV driver amenity building.
- Drive-thru coffee shop with 36 parking spaces, 10 of which are EV spaces.
- Over 1000 parking spaces will be provided for all vehicle types and road users, nearly 200 of which are EV (Electric Vehicle) ready with provision for further spaces to be converted to EV charging spaces in the future.
 - 651 main car park spaces
 - 552 standard spaces
 - 28 EV spaces
 - 40 Future EV spaces
 - 24 accessible spaces
 - 7 EV accessible spaces
 - 19 motorcycle spaces
 - 20 caravan spaces
 - 36 coach spaces
 - 362 HGV spaces – 60 of which are EV ready spaces
- Two fuel stations, one for cars, vans, and light goods vehicles, and a separate forecourt for HGVs and coaches.



We have designed plenty of green spaces for drivers to enjoy on their visit and provide new spaces and habitats for wildlife.

- 70% of the total site area will be green spaces including landscaping and areas for biodiversity net gain.
- 24% of the overall site area will be exclusively dedicated to biodiversity net gain, which will be located on around 12 hectares of land to the south of the site, inside the M25.
